The university, known as Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University, shines with far-sighted, advanced goals and numerous merits. Established as an autonomous institution on October 8, 1962, on Vijayadashami, its primary aim has been the all-around development, propagation, and dissemination of Sanskrit language. When the Central Sanskrit Universities Act, 2020, was passed in the Lok Sabha, this Vidyapeetha transitioned into a Central Sanskrit University. Subsequently, the university, adhering to the new regulations, began conducting all its activities primarily in Sanskrit. In this context, industrial guidelines and standards were translated into Sanskrit and made available on the website.

The university has translated its vision statement, mission statement, regulations, constitutional bodies, written rules, and industrial guidelines into Sanskrit, and many of these are accessible online. Information regarding these is also available on the university's website. In administration, management, note-writing on files, notice boards, official notifications, and teacher-related announcements, Sanskrit is the primary medium of communication. Across various departments, most notices are issued in Sanskrit. All chairpersons of departments are proficient scholars and administrators in Sanskrit. Notices related to academic activities involving students are issued primarily in Sanskrit, with Hindi, English, or other Indian languages as supplementary mediums. The university functions as a central administrative coordinator for managing all its departments.

At the university's entrance, an appropriate board with administrative terms, Sanskrit slogans, and instructions is displayed in Sanskrit, Hindi, and English for viewing and adherence. Within the campus, there are several boards for announcements, terminology, and almanac readings placed at suitable locations. To achieve its objectives and implement various schemes or programs of the Government of India, the university undertakes the following activities:

1. Translation of the vision and mission statements into Sanskrit, visible on the institution's website.
2. Numerous documents have been translated into Sanskrit, and the goals and objectives are also rendered into Sanskrit and uploaded online.
3. To exchange traditional Sanskrit knowledge across the country, MOUs have been signed with seven institutions, details of which are noted on the portal.
4. The university's rules and regulations are published on the website.
5. Sanskrit education at undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral levels follows traditional methodologies.
6. Teacher training in Sanskrit is provided at undergraduate (B.Ed.) and postgraduate (M.Ed.) levels.
7. Promotion of research in various Sanskrit disciplines.

8. Preservation and publication of rare manuscripts and significant books in Sanskrit libraries.

The university comprises several departments, including Adhunik Gyan, Humanities, Sahitya, Nyaya Vyakaran, Dharmashastra, Puran Itihaas, Advaita Vedanta, Sarva Darshan Jain Darshan, Sankhya Yoga, Mimamsa, Vedas, Vastu Shastra, and Jyotisha. Departmental notices are mostly issued in Sanskrit. Many students enroll in research activities to achieve the "Vidya Varidhi" (Ph.D.) degree. All research activities are conducted exclusively in Sanskrit. A vast library exists that houses books and manuscripts across various fields of knowledge.

1. Entrance Examination for Undergraduate and Teacher Training Levels: Every year, the university conducts a national-level Sanskrit medium entrance examination for admission to teacher training courses, selecting students based on merit. Teacher training is conducted in Sanskrit using modern techniques. Each year, the university produces many capable Sanskrit teachers who teach effectively at the secondary level across India.
2. Management of Sanskrit Learning Promotion Activities: Many students engage in research, and to encourage them, the university provides scholarships and awards the degree of Vidya Varidhi. To enhance the interest of research scholars, lectures by eminent scholars are organized periodically across all departments.
3. Publication of Distinguished Texts and Research Works: The university publishes various works meticulously edited by scholars, including standard Sanskrit texts and research works.
4. Implementation of Rules and Policies: The university diligently adheres to policies such as the regulations for Vidya Varidhi, consultation processes, collaborative activities, the code of conduct for students, and the code of conduct for teachers.
