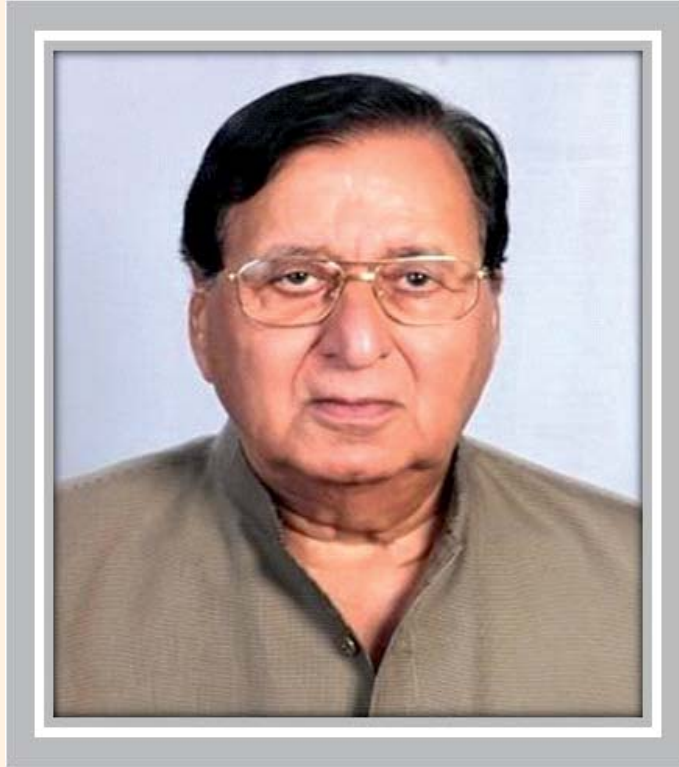

It is with a sense of deep responsibility and pride that I present the Annual Report of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University, New Delhi for the academic year 2024-25. The year under review reflects a decisive phase in the University's journey—marked by strengthened inter-institutional collaboration, academic expansion, policy consolidation, quality assurance initiatives, and renewed commitment towards the national mission of Sanskrit education and the Indian Knowledge System.



A landmark academic and cultural initiative of the year was the Utkarsh Mahotsava, hosted by Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University, which brought together three Central Sanskrit Universities on a single academic platform. The Mahotsava, graced by the august presence of Shri Giriraj Singh, Hon'ble Union Minister, symbolized a collective resolve to advance Sanskrit studies beyond institutional boundaries and to take Sanskrit learning to every section of society. This joint endeavour reaffirmed the shared vision of Central Sanskrit Universities to work in coordination for the wider propagation, academic enrichment, and global outreach of Sanskrit.

Another significant institutional development during the year was the registration and effective functioning of the Alumni Association as an independent unit, fostering academic interaction, mentoring, and sustained engagement with former students. During the period, Maharaja Agarsen Naturopathy and Yoga Research Trust was granted affiliation with the University, further expanding its academic outreach. In parallel, key institutional policies including the Research Policy and Consultancy Policy were implemented, and the e-Samarth module has been adopted and operationalized to nearly 50%, supporting the daily academic and administrative routines of the University.

A major academic milestone of the year was the establishment of the School of Purana Vidya, reflecting the University's commitment to a structured and interdisciplinary approach to India's ancient knowledge traditions. The School has been constituted with five proposed specialized departments—Puranavidya, Puratatva, Prachin Itihas, Dharmagam, and Sangeet—which are presently at the establishment stage and are envisaged to integrate textual traditions, historical inquiry, philosophical studies, religious traditions, and performing arts within a unified academic framework.

Significantly, during the year, the University has successfully submitted the IIQA, SSR, and DVV proceedings for the Third Cycle of NAAC Accreditation. This submission is the outcome of sustained institutional efforts towards academic quality, governance reforms, research output, student support systems, infrastructure development, and community engagement. Based on the robust documentation, academic performance indicators, and quality benchmarks achieved by the University, we remain confident of securing an A++ Grade after the NAAC peer team review.

Throughout the year, the statutory authorities, academic bodies, schools, centres, cells, and administrative sections functioned with diligence and coordination, ensuring transparency, accountability, and academic excellence. The collective efforts of faculty members, officers, staff, researchers, and students have been in the central position to the University's steady progress.

## Introduction

SHRI LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI NATIONAL SANSKRIT UNIVERSITY, formerly known as SHRI LAL BAHADUR SHASTRI RASHTRIYA SANSKRIT VIDYAPEETHA, stands as a beacon of Shastraic tradition, higher learning, and the interpretation of Shastras. As per the aspirations of the then President of India Dr. Rajendra Prasad and other national leaders of the country Akhil Bhartiya Sahitya Sammelan established Akhil Bhartiya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha on 8th October, 1962. Establishment of an international Sanskrit Institution in Delhi, the capital of India was the vision of the late Prime Minister Shri Lal Bahadur Shastriji. After Shastriji's death the then Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi on 2nd Oct, 1966 named it as Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha.

On 1st April, 1967 the government of India took over the Vidyapeetha as an autonomous institution under the Ministry of Education. From 21 December, 1970 under the Management of Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, this Vidyapeetha was named as Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Kendriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha. On 16th Nov, 1987, it conferred the status of Deemed-to-be-University by erstwhile Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. It became fully operational on 1st November 1991, with funding from the UGC.

### **Transition to Central University:**

The Government of India, under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji, approved the transition of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth into a Central University which came into effect from April 30th 2020, marking a significant milestone in the institution's journey.

The University presently has 5 schools having 22 departments with 109 regular teachers and 2141 students. The programmes offered by the university cover a wide range of subjects in Traditional Shastras, Sanskrit Language and Literature, Advanced Research, Modern Subjects, teacher training programme, diploma and certificate courses etc. The university's remarkable academic performance is evident through good publications, innovations, employability traits and entrepreneurship. SLBSNSU fosters a multilingual and multicultural academic ambiance. Teachers as well as students from all over the country are teaching and studying respectively in various programmes including Ph.D. The university encompasses around 40 percent of female students. The university is having good infrastructure with excellent ICT facilities to meet academic needs of the University including faculty members and students.

### **Academic Vision:**

SLBSNSU comprises six schools, each contributing to the academic vision of the University. The School of Veda-Vedanga, School of Darshan, School of Sahitya and Sanskriti, School of Education, School of Adhunik Vidya and School of Puran Vidya provide a comprehensive platform for the study of traditional Shastra disciplines, teacher training programs, and advanced courses in Shiksha Shastra.

The University, committed to research and scholarly activities, conducts an all-India entrance examination for scholars interested in pursuing research in various branches of Shastraic learning. Additionally, an independent Publication unit preserves and publishes historical works, including the research journal Shodha-Prabha.

### Achievements and Recognitions:

The recognition by NAAC as an 'A' grade institution is a testament to the quality of education and the university's unwavering commitment to academic excellence is evident across its academic initiatives. Furthermore, the Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has submitted its SSR (Self Study Report) and DVV (Data Validation and Verification) for the third-cycle of NAAC accreditation. The NAAC Peer Team Visit is scheduled for upcoming year.

## Vision & Mission

### Vision

- \* To preserve and promote the rich tradition of Shastric knowledge, interpreting ancient wisdom in the context of modern challenges, ensuring its continued relevance and significance.

### Mission

- To provide comprehensive education in traditional Sanskrit studies, with specialized focus on advanced disciplines.
- To foster advance research in Sanskrit education and the Indian Knowledge System.
- To conduct in-depth studies of classical and contemporary Sanskrit literature.
- To enrich understanding of Sanskrit heritage through rigorous research.
- To offer in-depth interpretations of Shastras, integrating traditional and contemporary perspectives.
- To provide deep understanding in Sanskrit knowledge and advanced training in Shastric components like Jyotish, Vastushastra, and Yoga.
- To preserve and critically analyze ancient manuscripts.
- To train and develop competent Sanskrit teachers for schools.
- To prepare teacher educators and faculty for higher education institutions.
- To achieve excellence in Sanskrit education and research, establishing a distinct and esteemed reputation.

## Objectives

The University has been established to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional, research, and extension facilities to the promotion of the Sanskrit language and such other branches of learning as it may deem fit; to make special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences, and science in its educational programmes; to make appropriate measures for promoting innovations in the teaching learning process, inter-disciplinary studies, and research; and to educate and train manpower for the overall development, promotion, preservation, and research in the field of Sanskrit and Sanskrit traditional subjects

To meet the stated vision and mission, the following objectives are formulated :

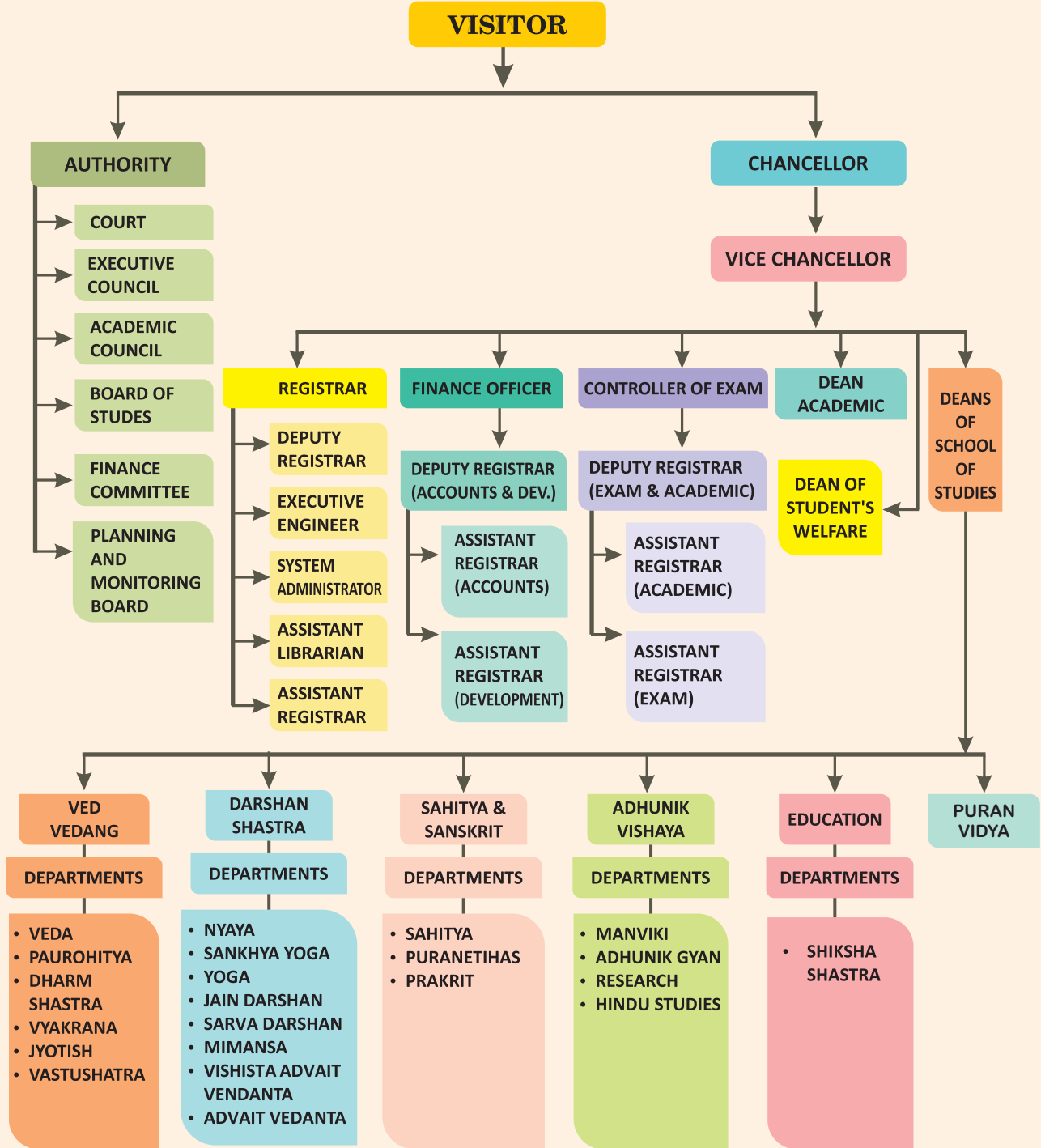
- To develop insight in underlying knowledge of various shastras.
- To develop competencies for interpretation of the shastras.
- To relate relevance of the shastras to the problems in the modern context.

- iv. To provide means for intensive training in modern as well as shastraic lore.
- v. To provide opportunities for taking research in Sanskrit Education and its various discipline.
- vi. To explore the relation of Indian knowledge system specially traditional sanskrit discipline with modern subjects and relevance in contemporary context.
- vii. To develop pedagogical skills and competencies especially for teaching Sanskrit and various shastras.

In pursuance of the above objectives, the University has decided to:

- i. Provide for the training of Sanskrit teachers and conduct of research in pedagogical aspects of Sanskrit Education.
- ii. Provide facilities for the study of such languages and literatures of Asia that have a bearing on Sanskrit studies, such as Pali, Iranian, Tibetan, Mongolian, Chinese, Japanese, etc.
- iii. Prescribe syllabus for various courses with special emphasis on Indian culture and values and conduct examinations in Sanskrit and allied disciplines.
- iv. Publish literature and develop print and non-print materials in and about Sanskrit, including original texts, commentaries and translations of manuscripts.
- v. Arrange for publication of research findings, journals and aids to research such as indices, digests and bibliographical materials.
- vi. Collect, preserve and publish manuscripts and build up a National Sanskrit Library and Museum and provide means for training in manuscriptology, specifically in scripts used in Sanskrit studies.
- vii. Provide means for education in modern disciplines needed for meaningful interpretation of original Sanskrit texts including technical literature in Sanskrit.
- viii. Promote interaction between modern and traditional scholars for mutual understanding on various issues related to scholarship.
- ix. Organize Shastra Parishads, Seminars, Conferences and Workshops.
- x. Recognize degrees, diplomas and certificates of other educational bodies, and Institutes as equivalent to those of the University.
- xi. Establish faculties and constitute such boards and committees as may be necessary for the fulfillment of the objectives of the University.
- xii. Institute and award fellowships, scholarships, prizes and medals in accordance with the rules and by-laws adopted from time to time.
- xiii. Subscribe to and become a member of, or co-operate with, any other association, society or institution having wholly or partly similar objectives as those of the University.
- xiv. Undertake all such activities, necessary or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objectives of the University.

## Teaching Learning Centre Presently Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre



### a) About the centre

**Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTC) of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University (Central University), New Delhi** formerly Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) was established in Sept., 2023 by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Ministry of Education, Government of India. The vision of this centre is to develop skills & competencies in the higher education faculty members for better teaching, learning and research in line with NEP 2020. The capacity building of faculty across all levels of Higher Education is one of the thrust areas of quality & excellence in education which is well catered through training programmes conducted by HRDC's of UGCs & various Centres under PMMMNMTT scheme. In keeping view the optimal utilization of infrastructure, human & financial resources, the Ministry of Education (MOE) has sought that synergy & integration between these two Centres should be strengthened and the entire capacity building effort to be renamed & popularized as **MALAVIYA MISSION** through **Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Programme (MMTP)** which was **inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister of Education Sh. Dharmendra Pradhan on 5th September 2023**. To implement this programme, 111 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) (66 HRDCs & 45 Centres under PMMMNMTT scheme) were identified as **Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centres (MMTCs)** and our university has been one of the listed MMTT Centre which was inaugurated by **Hon'ble Chairman of UGC Prof. M. Jagdesh Kumar on 30th October 2023**.

In Phase (2024-25), **10 training programmes** were **successfully** organized by the Centre under the **1178 participants (One thousand one hundred seventy eight)** from all the states & UTs of India were benefitted. These 10 programmes were **1 Online Faculty Induction Programme, 4 Online Refresher Course, 1 Residential Faculty Development Programme and 4 online Faculty Development Programme**. ## Computer Centre



The Computer Centre provides quality service to the university community in computing facilities, training, teaching, e-mail, website hosting, Development and Management etc. It helps researchers to get their valuable data analyzed, extends Internet facilities in the University, enables access to World Wide Web and provides laboratory facility to the students of various courses. The center caters the needs of the students, faculty and staff members of the University.

### Establishment History :

In 1989, Department of Electronics, Govt. Of India gave a joint project "CASTLE" (Computer Assisted Sanskrit Teaching/Learning Environment) to the University with JNU, New Delhi. After this in 1993, the University got another project "CALT " (Computer Assisted Language Teaching) from Department of Electronics. The University established a small working computer lab in 1989 for these two projects and introduced a computer course as an optional subject in Shiksha Shastri. Since then, the University has contributed and developed a lot in the field of computer technology.

The UGC has approved the Computer Centre to the University in December, 2005. The University established a well-equipped Computer Centre in June, 2006 and the center become functional in January 2007.

#### **Present IT Infrastructure:**

- The University has Trilingual Website in Sanskrit, Hindi & English languages with new technology and fully dynamic as per GIGW guidelines.
- The University has implemented Samarth eGov Suite, Recruitment, Entrance test and Admission process along with staff management software system for smooth and digitized manner University operation.
- The University has 03 well equipped Computer Labs, 08 Smart classroom and 07 Seminar/ conference hall with internet facility and using the various teaching tools like podium, interactive panels with OPS multimedia projectors and various kinds of educational software's as per syllabus to enhance student learning skills to meet the new challenges.
- The University has a Virtual e-class room studio for recording of video lectures in Sanskrit for SWAYAM portal of UGC.
- Internet Bandwidth: Centre has Internet facilities with 1.0 GBPS internet link under NKN Project of Ministry of HRD. This provides opportunities to students, faculties, researchers and all the department to access and download the information of all kind from various sources.
- The University has established one virtual e-classroom studio with centralized recording and controlling platform which is easiest to Use and Best Supported for Rich Media Live Webcasting & Content Management, Web & Mobile Delivery system which will be all inclusive package of fully integrated solution including the hardware, Software, Networking, Audio-Visual Conferencing, control systems and centralized recording and controlling system.
- The University has Trilingual Website in Sanskrit, Hindi & English languages and now upgraded with new technology, fully dynamic as per GIGW guidelines.
- The University has own IP based EPABX Facility with analog, digital and IP extension lines and provides, high availability, strong security, powerful performance and cost-effective unified communications.
- The University has installed the server for access the thesis through intranet.
- The University has installed 85 CCTV cameras in various locations.
- The University whole campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

#### **General Facilities Provided by the Computer Centre**

The Computer Centre provides quality service to the University in computing facilities, e-mail, website hosting, Development & management etc. It helps researchers to get their valuable data analysed, extends Internet facilities in the University, enables access to World Wide Web and provides laboratory facility to the students of the University. It caters to the following requirements of the University:-

- Designing, development and maintenance of software services as per the need of University.

- Designing, development and maintenance of software services as per the need of University.
- Purchase, installation, and maintenance of desktop, laptop, printers and server computers within the University.
- Maintenance of all the Computers, Peripherals and networking including their AMC.
- Maintenance of all the various servers of the University.(Server management).
- To provide internet access to various teaching & non-teaching departments of the University, staff residences, hostels, guest house etc.
- To provide telecom facilities to the various departments, hostel, staff residences, guest house etc. and managing the communication system software.
- Management of firewall system to protect the University network from outside hackers, to balance the load on the network, to filter unnecessary traffic, to block unwanted web content and to streamline network traffic by specifying priorities.
- Troubleshooting in resolving network, telecom & hardware related problems of the employees working at the University.
- Management of the IT infrastructure, resolving the network related issues of the labs of the University.
- In-house repair work of the desktop, printers and other peripherals.
- To maintained the mailing system and official emails through @gov.in and our domain freeware educational account on Google.
- To provide Computer training to the University Students & Staff from time to time.
- To take Backup and Recovery of user home directories on the storage/file server weekly basis.
- To introduce three certificate courses in various areas of Computer Science under self-financing scheme on weekend days. Duration of this course is 6 Months.
- To manage official website of the University: Apart from the general information related to the University, the website of the University provides the following facilities for users:-
  - The website of the University is trilingual i.e. in Sanskrit, Hindi & English.
  - Tenders & Career: Publishing the quotations/tenders and job postings.
  - Posting different types of forms, circular, notifications etc.
  - E-Resources: Faculty & Students have access to e-resources like Knimbus which is useful for their research work.
  - Alumni Registration: Ex-students of the University can register themselves through website.

- Admission information: Website provides complete information on admission procedure, prospectus for entrance examination and other related information prospectus, application forms, results etc.
- The website information is updated in-house by the Computer Centre according to the request from the respective departments of the University.

#### **Training & Courses:**

In addition to regular computer subjects in various disciplines, computer center also runs training programme for students, research scholars, teaching & non-teaching staff members to enhance their computer skills and working knowledge for various software as required in their work.

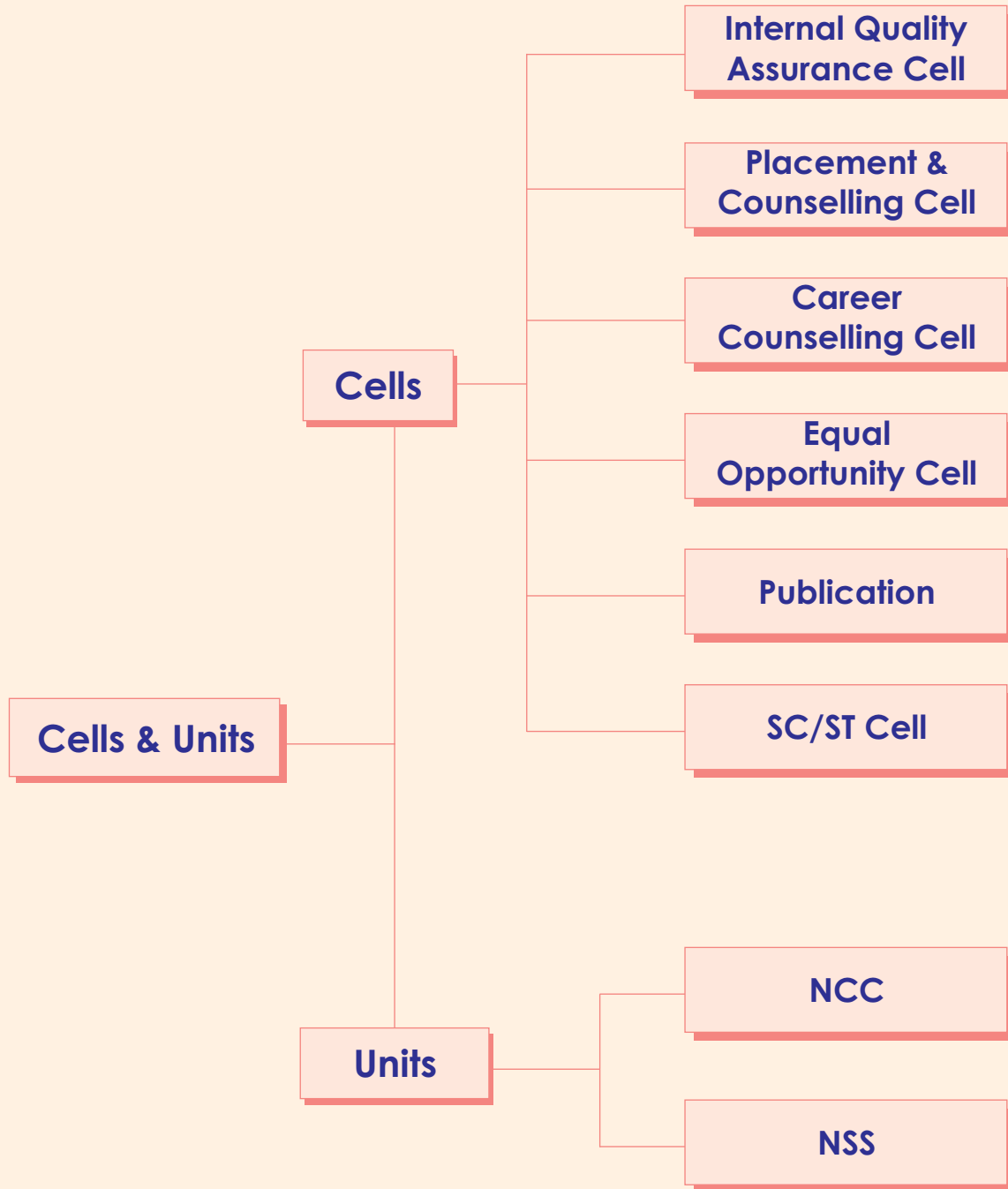

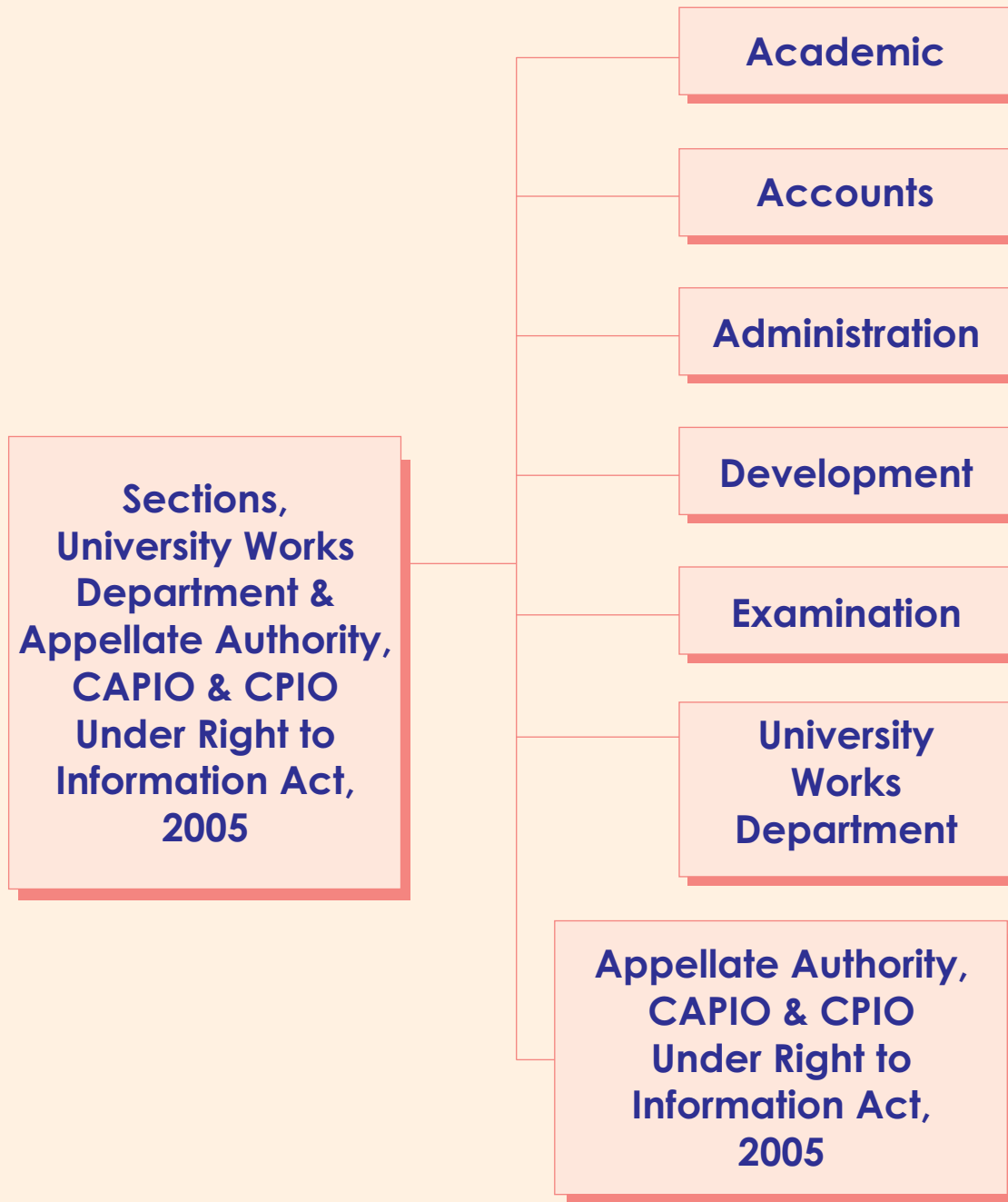
### a) About NSS

### University Works Department (UWD)

The University Works Department (UWD) look after the maintenance of the **following Land and Building of the University Campus:-**

The university campus is located on a modest plot of 10.65 acres in Qutab Institutional Area on the Shaheed Jeet Singh Marg in South Delhi. This university is located on prime land near a number of national and international academic institutions, including IIT Delhi, NCERT, NUEPA, IIFT, IMI, JNU, ISI, KVS, and others. This campus is conveniently located, well-connected, well-managed, and well-kept. A guest house and a boys' hostel are among the eight residential buildings, which include four academic buildings and a guest house. All of the buildings are well connected by roads. On campus, there are several small parks and gardens, such as Vishranti Vatika and Swarna Jayanti Park. On-campus water and power are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, thanks to DG sets, tube wells, and a sewage treatment plant. High-mass lighting systems are used on campus to ensure proper outdoor lighting.

The four (4) Academic Buildings in the University are:-

1. Shaikshanik Sadan: - It is the oldest known two-story building, with a total area of 3431.81 square metres. Academic, research, and library departments are all situated there. This building includes all Darshan Adhunik Vidya and Sahitya & Sanskriti faculty departments.
2. Saraswat Sadhana Sadan:- It is a 5-story (B+G+3) structure with a total area of 4031.26 square metres. In this building, one lift is also operational. The Vice-Chancellor Secretariat, Computer Center including computer labs, Conference Hall (Vachaspati Sabhagar), and Committee Rooms are all located there.
3. Vrihaspati Bhawan: - It is a two-story structure with a total area of 410.40 square metres. It houses the Veda and Pourohitya departments. There is also a Karmakand Prayogshala on the premises.
4. Swarna Jayanti Sadan:- It is a 5-story (B+G+3) building with such a total area of 6283 square metres. This structure has three elevators and four stairwells. The building was constructed in accordance with the construction bye-laws. Administrative departments such as Administration, Finance, Academic, Development, Statistical

Cell, Central Store, Offices of the Registrar, Finance Officer, and Proctor, as well as academic departments such as Jyotish, Vastushastra, Vyakarana (Grammar), Dharmashastra (Science of Jurisprudence), Shiksha Shastra (Education), Faculty of Education, Committee Room, and others are accommodated there.

All academic buildings, except the Vrihaspati Bhawan, are interconnected to one another. Proper arrangement of Roof Top Harvesting of all these buildings has been made.

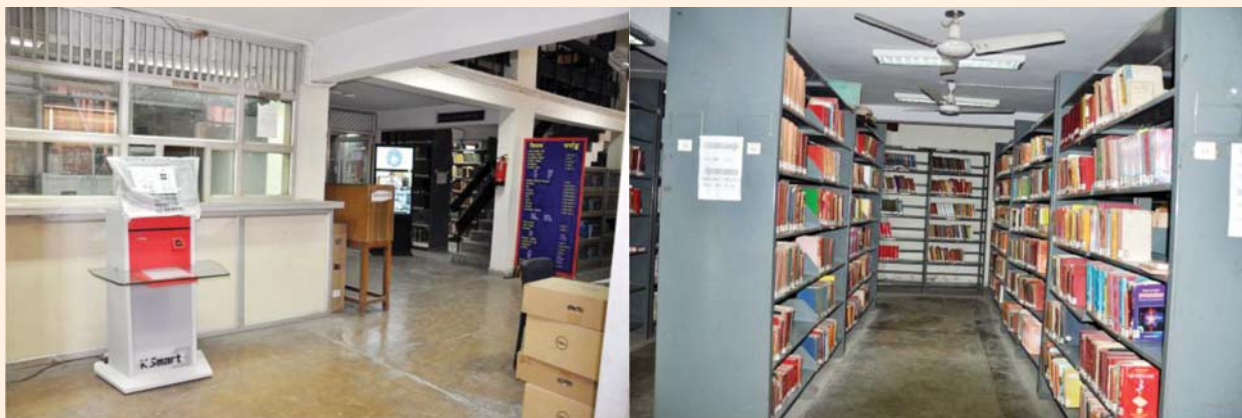

#### a) About the Library

Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University's Central Library existed from its inception with the mission of facilitating access to and preserving information and knowledge resources needed by the University community, as well as enabling access to an impartial learning and research environment. The library, also known as Mahamahopadhyaya Padam Shri Dr. Mandan Mishra Central Library, comprises a comprehensive collection of major Sanskrit texts, encompassing Vedas, Purans, Upnishads, Dharamshastras, Yoga, Jyotish, Vyakarana, Vastushastra, Sahitya, Darshan, Paurohitya, Ayurveda etc. Apart from Education, Philosophy, Psychology, Hindi, English, and other contemporary disciplines, the library is a veritable treasure trove of information.

The Central Library has initiated technology based service to the user namely.

## Divyangjan Friendly Campus

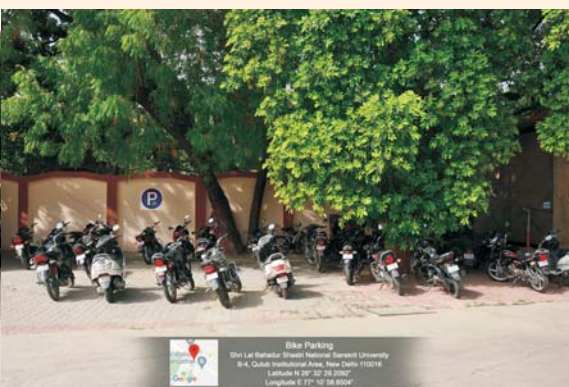
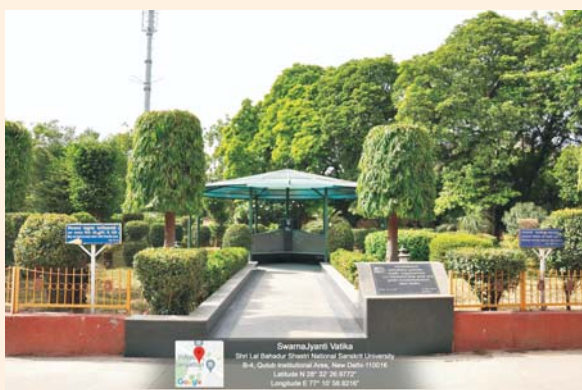
University is keen on providing facilities for divyangjan. The university building is designed and constructed to keep the basic needs of in mind while providing a friendly atmosphere.

The university provides physical facilities like wheel chair, rest room and ramp with railing to the divyangjan.



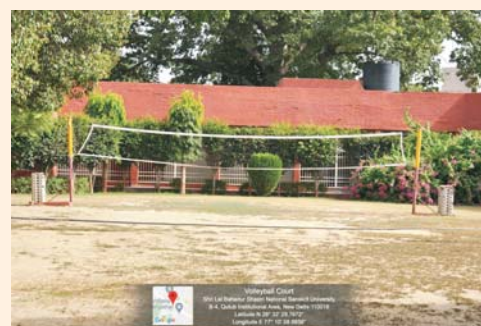
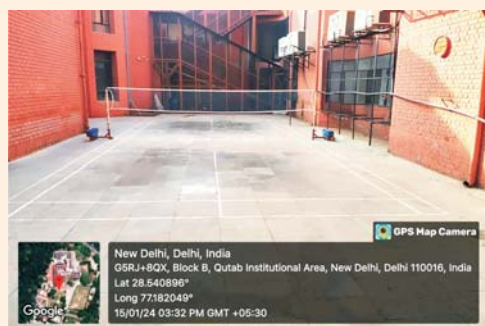
## Eco-Safe Campus

## Versatile Venues: Elevating academic experiences with cutting-edge facilities

The multipurpose hall boasting a capacious 400 sitting capacity is equipped with advance sound system, sophisticated lighting and modern amenities. It serves as a hub for grand events and academic discussions. Complimenting this, offer seven Committee Halls with flexible sitting capacity ranging from 20 to 80 persons each featuring projectors, screens and recording systems. These hall are tailored for collaborative discussions, presentations and online meetings, enhancing the versatility of our academic spaces.





### Virtual Class Room/Studio

The University has set up a single Virtual E-Classroom studio with a centrally managed recording and controlling platform that is the simplest to use and best supported for rich media Live Webcasting & Content Management, Web & Mobile Delivery System. This system will be an all-inclusive package of fully integrated solution including the hardware, software, Networking, Audio-Visual Conferencing, Control Systems, and unified recording and controlling system.



## Guest House (Vishranti Nilayam)

The Guest House is a non-commercial entity of the University called "**VISHRANTI NILAYAM**" and is used for educational purposes. The two-storied Guest House building has eight double rooms, two VIP suites, a dining area, and an office room which is well furnished & equipped with AC & LCD. On request, the Guest House can host stay for national and international delegates/members, as well as visiting dignitaries, ideally in connection with academic and research activity.



## Hostel

The University has one boys' hostel, which has 51 rooms and can accommodate 99 students. For research scholars and senior students, there are 16 single bedded rooms, 18 double bedded rooms, and 17 triple bedded rooms. The hostel has amenities such as a common room, dining hall, refreshment hall, kitchen, and pantry, as well as a local area network, computer, TV, and telephone.

**Dr. Sundar Narayan Jha** looks after the duties of hostel's warden since 2021-22. The management, maintenance and other operations are controlled & monitored by the Hostel Warden & Hostel Committee.



## Recreation Room

For healthy recreation and mutual contact among the University's female employees, the university provides one recreation room. This area was created to give ladies a place to rest, study, and have informal chats during their free time. There are a few indoor games, fitness equipments and full body massager machine for pain relief available. Newspapers and journals are also available for employee use in the communal reading room. Peons are stationed in the leisure room to tend to the requirements of the female employees.



## Gymnasium

All students have access to the gym at the University. According to the phrase, "A healthy mind resides in a healthy body," a professionally managed atmosphere is established for the students. Individuals' physical and mental health are essential factors in their overall well-being. The campus has an indoor fully air-conditioned in-house gymnasium, which is in keeping with the goal of all-round development of the students. It has top-of-the-line fitness and workout equipment, such as treadmills and strength machines. In short, the gym provides a healthy environment for students to develop both physically and mentally.



## Temple

In the University Campus community, the Temple plays an important role in all aspects of daily life. The temple is noteworthy not just for its religious features, but also for the cultural, social, and educational qualities that it gives to the community as a Sanskrit University. The temple is an important aspect of Hinduism's daily life. To a Hindu, the temple is more than just a magnificent structure to look at and appreciate; it is the epicentre of intellectual, artistic, spiritual, educational, and social elements of daily life. Every new term begins with a special puja at the University Temple on campus.



## Residential Quarters

The University has 48 staff quarters for teaching and non-teaching employees, which includes seven Type-V quarters, eight Type-IV quarters, eight Type-III quarters, eight Type-II quarters, sixteen Type-I quarters, and one Vice-Chancellor's Bungalow.



## Shishu Sadan

The safety and the security of children is always a major concern for working mothers. The University offers a Shishu Sadan to help working mothers (from the teaching and non-teaching staff) to carry out their dual role, of home and work, to reduce their stress relating to the welfare and the well being of their child. The Shishu Sadan of the University aims at providing a comfortable, safe and secure environment for the children of the University's employees.

Such a Centre is a very useful facility for the University's employees as it provides supervision and care for infants and young children during the daytime, to enable their parents, especially the mothers, to perform their jobs and continue employment at the University.



## Vedshala

In order to impart practical knowledge of Siddhant Jyotish to the students of the Department of Jyotish, there is an Observatory on the University Campus. It was built by the erstwhile HoD of Jantar-Mantar, Jaipur, the President Award winner, Late M.M. Pandita Kalyan Dutt Sharma. While the Karka Valaya, Tula Valaya and Makara Valaya help in knowing about the different rashis, the Bhatti Yantra and Chakra Yantra facilitate acquiring the knowledge of Kranti; through the Nadi Valaya the knowledge of local time is possible. The Samrat Yantra facilitates mastering the knowledge of Yamyottaralangan kal, local time, and standard time. The Bharatiya Tara Mandal helps in finding Natansha, Akshansha and Krantyansha, etc.



## Yajnashala

There is a Yajnashala in the University's campus where diploma and training courses for the priests of the capital city, are organized. Various types of Bhadra Mandalas have been made in the Yagyashala for the Vedic rituals and yagyas. Like- Sarvatobhadra Mandal, Chaturbhadra Mandal, Vastu Mandal, Ekashitipad Vastu Mandal, Navagraha Mandal, Shodash Matrika Mandal, Sapta Ghr̥it Matrika Mandal, Kashetrapal Mandal include Yogini Mandal and various types of mandalas have been illustrated. In this Yagyashala, study and teaching is done by the Guru-Shishya tradition, for that the Guru and the Shishya, duly sitting on the mat, wearing the corresponding clothes, costumes (Dhauti, Kurta, Uttariya etc.) sit face to face and keep the asanastha text on top of the wood pedestal, do self study. Apart from this, the practical activities are done directly in this Yagyashala.



## Shrautyagyashala

As we all know that the basis of all religions is the Vedas which propound religion through karma and knowledge. The path of karma in these is in the form of Yagya Dharma.



Most of the Vedas propound this Yagya Vidya. All these Yagya experiments are scientific experiments. Ancient Rishi-scientists used to do various Yagya experiments for the welfare of mankind. Just as the scientists of today use some laboratory to do various experiments, similarly those ancient Rishi-scientists also used Yagshalas to do these scientific Yagya experiments. Therefore, to do various Yagya experiments, the Yagshalas are also designed according to the same purpose. Some of the Yags have to be done by the Ahitaagniyaman throughout his life. For such Yags, a permanent Yagshala has been prescribed, like this Ishtiyagavihar. In this Vihar, the Yagyas that are to be performed lifelong for the Agnihotri Yajaman can be performed such as Nitya Sayam-Prataragnihotra, Darshapoomnamaseshtiyag, Aagryaneshtiyag etc. Since this altar is the basis of Yagyaya Karma, whenever we have to do Yagya-related rituals or studies, it is impossible without such an altar. Understanding the necessity of this altar, the Honorable Vice Chancellor Prof. Murlimanohar Pathak has built a Shrouta Yagyashaala named "Shrouteshhtiyag Vihar" in the campus of the university for the students of the Veda department to study Shrouta Yagya rituals, which is built according to Katyayan Shroutasutra.

### Rain Water Harvesting System

In 2004-05, the University established efficient rainwater collection arrangements with the help of senior scientists from the Central Ground Water Board, Ministry of Water Resources, Government of India. To effectively cover the entire complex, seven rain water harvesting bores were dug at four distinct places as proposed by the C.G.W.B.



### Roof Top Solar Power Plant

The agency M/s Azure Power Roof Top One Pvt. Ltd., under the Solar Energy Corporation of India Ministry of New & Renewable Energy Govt. of India, erected a 151.27 KWp Roof Top Solar Power Plant in RESCO mode on the roof tops of existing University buildings.



### Sewage Treatment Plant

In 2006-07, the University installed the latest FAB type Sewage Treatment Plant with a filter press with a capacity of 120 kL/d to reuse wastewater generated by the University complex's kitchens, baths, and latrines, as well as other services for flushing toilets in Non-Residential Buildings and for horticultural purposes. Throughout the year, except for a few days during in the rainy season, the University uses 100 % of the wastewater by treating it through the STP and effectively using it for maintenance and development of University parks and gardens, including for flushing toilets in non-residential buildings. The filter press transforms solid wastes formed following wastewater treatment into cakes, which are used as manure for horticulture activities. As a consequence, the University uses treated wastewater throughout the year and STP operates round the clock.



## Sports, Academic and Extra Curricular Activities

### 1. Sports Activities

For sound physical and mental health, game and sports have their own significance. Bearing this fact in mind, the University conducted various games and sports activities for students. Dr. Manoj Kumar Meena is the In-charge of Sports Department of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University. Partition Horrors Remembrance Day is an Annual National Memorial Day observed on 14th August every year, commemorating the sacrifices of the victims and sufferings of the people during the 1947 partition of India. It was first observed in 2021, after announcement by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi.



## 16. Independence Day

On August 15, 2024, Independence Day was commemorated in the University premises. The Vice-Chancellor was given the Guard of Honour performed by the University's N.C.C cadets. Following the inspection of Guard of Honour, Vice-Chancellor garlanded the statue of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastriji's. The National Flag was also hoisted by the Vice-Chancellor.
