03 Days Online National Workshop on
Designing & Development of e-Courses
From 16th to 18th November, 2021

Brief Report

The Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University (Central University), New Delhi established under the scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India organized 03 Days Online National Workshop on Designing & Development of e-Courses from 16th to 18th November, 2021 which is the 9th programme of Phase-V. The objectives of this programme were to acquaint the participants with the 4-Quadrant approach of designing e-courses, to give insight into the process of developing e-courses & to enhance the skills & competencies of designing & development of e-course. This programme was conducted in an online mode through Google Meet platform. The inaugural session commenced with the welcome speech and backdrop note by the Director of the Centre Prof. Amita Pandey Bhardwaj followed by the Presidential Address of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of our University, Prof. Murlimanohar Pathak. The registrations received for the programme were 42 and the same continued the programme successfully. Out of 42 participants, 30 were from 12 states and 12 from 02 UTs of our country. The participants from 12 states include Andhra Pradesh (01), Assam (01), Bihar (03), Chattisgarh (01), Gujarat (01), Haryana (02), Maharashtra (07), Rajasthan (01), Tamil Nadu (03), Uttarakhand (06) & Uttar Pradesh (03) while that of 02 UT was Delhi (10) & Jammu Kashmir (02). The programme was transacted through 20 distinctly designed sessions comprising of inaugural, induction, 08 demonstrations based technical sessions, 03 Question & Answer session, 03 self-practice sessions and 01 each of online assessment, feedback, sharing of experiences and valedictory sessions. All the technical sessions were conducted under the able guidance of 08 Resource Persons having expertise in the concerned area from various reputed institutions of the Country. The main themes covered in the programme were - e-Course Designing Approach & Format, e-Text Development, Video Development & Editing, e-Pictorial Content Development, Discussion Forum & Assessment, Publishing Platforms for e-Courses & CC Licensing. The participants were assigned 01 assignment based on various components of e-course development. An online test was administered where 56% of the participants scored above 60%. In order to ensure the quality of the lectures delivered from the participant's point of view online feedback about the Resource Persons was taken in 04 categories viz. Outstanding, Very good, Good & Satisfactory and the average found was 77%, 19%, 03% & 01% in the respective categories. In addition to this, online feedback about the programme was also taken on 10 points in five categories and the average percentage was found to be 73% in Excellent, 22% in Very good, 03% in Good, 01% in Satisfactory and 01% Unsatisfactory. In the valedictory session, the Director of the Centre welcomed the guests and presented the Programme report highlighting objectives, participation analysis, programme outcomes & feedback results followed by Chief Guest by Dr. Archana Thakur (Joint Secretary, UGC, New Delhi) & Presidential address by our Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. The programme ended with a vote of thanks followed by Shanti Path. E-Certificate and e-Photo album were mailed within a week to the successful participants after the completion of the programme.
