**Answer:**

The results of all courses conducted by the university are announced and published online. Students and teachers can access the results promptly through the university's website, which follows a user-friendly process. Relevant information can be obtained directly from the specified sections. There is a defined process for publishing results online, and the degrees awarded by the university follow this procedure.

The university offers courses such as Shastri (B.A.), B.Ed., Acharya (M.A.), M.Ed., and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.). Until 2021, a specialized Acharya program was also offered. The B.Ed. and M.Ed. programs follow the guidelines of the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), while other programs adhere to the norms of the University Grants Commission (UGC).

All of the university's programs are multi-faceted, designed with careful consideration of the subjects, timing, strength, and satisfaction. The courses aim to incorporate both classical and modern subjects that uphold Indian values while being contemporary and relevant. The university strives to ensure that these programs fulfill the expectations of both students and society, and all courses are designed to be satisfying for the students.

The university's Academic Council determines the curriculum. In consultation with the vice-chancellor, the council, which includes professors from the university and other institutions, finalizes the curriculum. The academic department manages the implementation of all courses and submits proposals to the Executive Council for approval. After approval at various levels, the finalized courses are published on the university website. The curriculum is updated periodically.

The academic department also evaluates the effectiveness of the curriculum. With the adoption of certain strategies, improvements in outcomes are observed, which encourages the implementation of other educational plans. The university's courses are designed in alignment with

its goals and objectives, and these programs support students in securing employment in various sectors.

Graduates of the Shastri program are eligible for various employment opportunities, including in banking, Indian Railways, state civil services, central civil services, and the Indian Postal Service. Graduates from the university have the same opportunities as graduates from other universities. Many have found careers in these sectors. Skill-based courses, such as certificate and diploma programs in Vastu Shastra (architecture), Jyotisha (astrology), Yoga, Sanskrit journalism, and priesthood, equip graduates with the skills and confidence to pursue independent careers. This is the direct outcome of the university's programs.

The university's curriculum integrates both ancient and modern knowledge. Sanskrit graduates proficient in English are encouraged to work abroad in the promotion of Sanskrit, representing India's cultural heritage.

The university follows a transparent policy that is both student-friendly and academically sound. All educational notices are displayed on the university's notice boards, making it easy for teachers and parents to access important information. This initiative ensures that the results of the courses are easily accessible.

In the Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.) program, candidates are informed about their oral examination via email and telephone. The names of successful candidates are published on the university website. Through the university's online presence, even distant candidates can feel as connected as those nearby. This results in the smooth implementation of the announced achievements.
