

6.5.5: Incremental improvements made during the preceding five years (in case of first cycle) Post accreditation quality initiatives (second and subsequent cycles)

1. The academic council has made a decision to implement the UGC regulations/guidelines for the award of degrees. Following the UGC guidelines, the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) has been implemented in the university in the same manner as in other universities/institutes.
2. The post of Controller of Examinations (COE) has been approved and filled by the university. As a result, several new initiatives have been implemented in the examination system.
3. The construction of the girls' hostel is underway under the HEFA and Ministry of Education (MOE) window, Fifth Scheme. A budget of one hundred percent from the government has been requested for the construction of the hostel. The Detailed Project Report (DPR) and other formalities have already been approved by the Executive Council (EC).
4. The position of librarian has not yet been approved by the Ministry. Several proposals have been submitted to the Ministry of Education (MOE) via the UGC guidelines, but approval is still pending.
5. The university has introduced new courses after research, such as B.A. (Yoga) Plus, M.A. (Hindi), M.A. (English), and M.A. (Yoga). Interdisciplinary programs are also being considered in subjects like Political Science, Sociology, etc.
6. A separate department named "Humanities" has been established by the university for subjects like English, Hindi, Political Science, Sociology, and others.
7. The university's strategic plan is aligned with the NEP 2020. The focus of the new curriculum includes work-oriented programs, curriculum reconstruction, research initiatives, and infrastructural development.
8. The university has started short-term vocational courses, in the form of diploma/certificate programs, in subjects like Astrology, Vastu Shastra, Yoga, and Grammar. These courses are designed to enhance students' practical skills and professional readiness.
9. To promote Sanskrit among the general public, the university has launched "Sanskrit Speaking Workshops." Additionally, the "Sanskrit Language Skill Development Centre" has been established. Through these initiatives, the university aims to engage with the community in an active manner. Furthermore, through the National Service Scheme (NSS), the university has included its students in various social service awareness programs.
10. Prof. Murali Manohar Pathak assumed the position of full-time Vice-Chancellor on 29.10.2021. Most of the vacant teaching positions have already been filled.
11. A fully functional career counselling unit has been established, and the recruitment unit is now fully operational. Both units regularly organize workshops, seminars, and career counselling sessions. A counselling system has been set up to support students, particularly those who need additional academic assistance.
12. The university has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with other Sanskrit universities such as the Central Sanskrit University, New Delhi, and the National Sanskrit University, Tirupati. According to the MoU, these three

universities will collaborate annually to organize academic discussions, seminars, special lectures, etc. To date, such programs have been held annually at all three universities. Additionally, an MoU has been signed with the Kavikulaguru Sanskrit University, Ramtek, and the Shrimad Jagadguru Sharada Sarvajnapeth. These efforts are part of the ongoing commitment to enhance academic cooperation and promote joint programs.

13. The university has already conducted a social audit that included gender inclusion aspects.
14. The university has appointed an Assistant Professor of Physical Education as the sports coordinator. The students of the university are provided with sufficient infrastructural and financial support to participate in inter-university, state, national, and international-level events. As a result of this initiative, many university students have won prizes at state, national, and international sports competitions. One student, Mr. Shastri, in his first year, won a silver medal at the "Senior Asian Championship-2023" held in Kyrgyzstan.
