	<p>The university is committed to the preservation and promotion of Indian knowledge traditions and Indian culture. Therefore, value education is an integral part of the curriculum, both in the academic and academic-administrative programs. For example, in the academic program, the dramatic work "Abhijnanasakuntalam" is included, which imparts moral education. In the language program, the teaching of grammar is accompanied by the teaching of ethics through the works of Kautilya's Arthashastra and the Bhagavad Gita. In the Vedic program, the teaching of Vedic literature and the Upanishads is included. In the Dharmashastra program, the teaching of moral education is imparted through the works of Manu Smriti and Yajnavalkya Smriti. The teaching of Chanakya's Arthashastra is also included. In the Darshanashastra program, the teaching of human values is imparted through the study of Yoga and other philosophies. The Bhagavad Gita is the most revered text in Indian culture and is included in the curriculum. The main goal of Indian philosophy is the attainment of Moksha, which is the ultimate human value. In literature, the works of Kalidasa such as Kumarasambhava and Raghuvansha are taught, which are the cornerstones of our culture. The Ramayana and Mahabharata are ideal epic poems that impart moral education. The Shrimad Bhagavat Purana is also included in the curriculum. All the eighteen knowledge centers in the Indian knowledge tradition impart moral education along with knowledge and science. In addition, the teaching of value education and human rights is compulsory in the academic program. Furthermore, in the B.Ed. and M.Ed. programs, value education is a part of the curriculum.
